Primate's Square

Opening of the City Gates

09:30 – 10:00 Primate's Square

The ceremonial opening of Bratislava City Days, staged in a historical setting, recalls the city's coronation tradition and reveals stories hidden within its more than 700-year history. The people of Bratislava will be transported through a significant period of history, united by their respect and love for the city and its inhabitants. To the sound of drums and fanfares, we will open the gates of the Primate's Palace, thereby symbolically opening the city as well.

11:00 PRESENTATION

An unconventional interactive presentation on Bratislava by SEEDS and LEBOMÄDVEĎ will reveal the city's lesser-known, surprising and amusing sides. Forget the textbook facts – you're in for a treat with curiosities, stories and fascinating tidbits from the city's historical past and everyday life.

The program takes a light-hearted approach, involving the audience through short activities and questions that draw you right into the story. Do you think you know Bratislava? Come and see for yourself – and you might discover a whole new side to it.

What do we eat?

12:30 LECTURE

A lecture on food, its quality, and its impact on our health and the world around us. Together, we'll explore the difference between real food and ultra-processed products, how to navigate today's food landscape, and what to look out for when making choices. The talk will be given by biologist, teacher, and blogger Peter Wetzler, who focuses on local and sustainable food both on his blog and in his science classes. He currently teaches science at LEAF Academy and is the author of the blog Lokálžrawetz.

Emissions around us

13:30 DISCUSSION

What are greenhouse gas emissions and where do we encounter them in our daily lives? The interview will provide a clear overview without unnecessary theory – it will explain why emissions matter and what we can do about them ourselves.

Martina Repíková, a researcher specialising in energy markets, renewable energy sources and sustainability, will guide you through the topic. Come and hear the facts presented in plain language and gain a practical understanding of the matter.

Is sustainability in fashion?

14:30 DISCUSSION

The clothing industry is one of the biggest polluters, yet it is also undergoing significant changes towards sustainability. The discussion will explore what sustainable fashion means today, and the role played by science, innovation and a responsible approach to production and consumption. We will examine the entire life cycle of clothing – from design and the selection of materials to its reuse or recycling – and explore the issues and solutions that are shaping the future of fashion. The guests on the discussion are Veronika Cyprichová (Drž Hubu! - English: Shut up!) and textile designer Michaela Bednářová (PUOJD).

Supporting biodiversity in urban environments

16:30 LECTURE

What is biodiversity, why do we need it, and what role does it play in the city? The talk will reveal connections that we often overlook – from small changes in our surroundings to their impact on our quality of life.

Alena Pavlíková from BROZ (a conservation association), a project manager and coordinator of biodiversity measures, will guide you through the topic. It explains, in a clear and engaging way, why biodiversity is important even in urban environments and how we can support it, even through small steps.

The City in Action

10:00 – 17:00

Experience the city in motion and discover how it functions in situations where every second counts. You can look forward to demonstrations by emergency services, the city police and modern technologies that are shaping the future of transport. An interactive zone where you can try out lots of things for yourself and take a peek behind the scenes at things we don't usually get to see.

Municipal Police: A special vehicle in action

The municipal police will be presenting a special emergency response vehicle at Komenského Square, designed for crisis situations such as floods and other emergencies.

Take a look at his kit and find out what technologies and tools assist with rescue operations – from extrication equipment to field gear. Curious visitors will be able to take a closer look at the vehicle and even try out the flashing lights.

Rescuers in action: How to save a life

The Emergency Medical Services Operations Centre will be holding interactive demonstrations of first aid and the use of an automated external defibrillator (AED) at Komenského Square.

Find out how rescuers work on the city's streets, what equipment they use and how they respond in critical situations. You'll learn how to react correctly when every second counts.

A robot controls traffic

What is it like when a robot takes control of traffic? The Slovak University of Technology and the Karlsruhe Institute of Technology, in collaboration with the Bratislava Municipal Police, will present a demonstration of a humanoid robot that will direct traffic on Komenského Square.

See for yourself how the robot coordinates the movements of cars, pedestrians, cyclists and scooter riders, and what the future of urban transport might look like.

The Anthropocene in Motion

Students from the MediaLab* studio at the Academy of Fine Arts and Design (VŠVU), led by lecturer and artist Ján Šicko, present the interactive installation The Anthropocene in Motion, which reflects on the current era in which human activity is fundamentally reshaping both the natural and social environments. The project explores the relationship between the image, technology and the viewer as part of this constantly evolving system.

The installation, situated within the Klarisky complex, blends the historic surroundings with digital media, with a large-format LED screen that reacts to the presence of visitors serving as its central feature. Alongside this, there is also a separate installation featuring an interactive traditional costume, which explores traditional cultural stereotypes in the context of identity.

Workshops for children

Planting in the orchard with the youngest children

10:00 – 12:30

Plant your own herb or flower and watch it grow right in your own home. Together, we'll celebrate Earth Day and enjoy working with the soil – with our hands covered in mud, in touch with nature and in the pleasant atmosphere of the orchard.

Tree Friends

13:00 – 18:00

Fun workshop for young nature explorers, organised by the Pestrec Association. Children will learn in a fun way how trees live – what happens both above and below ground – and discover that they have more in common with nature than they realise. They can look forward to exploring, playing and making little discoveries that will draw them into the world of trees.

A small kinetic object

13:00 – 18:00

Pop in and create your own little miracle of movement. Children can build their own structure using simple materials and finish it off with a colourful butterfly, which spins and comes to life right before their eyes with a gentle puff of air.

Playful creativity combines imagination, movement and discovery – all you need is a bit of paint, a pair of nimble hands and a breath of fresh air. The butterfly, as a symbol of transformation, naturally links the theme of the city with nature, and everyone will take their own unique creation home with them.

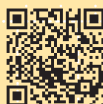
